Municipal Building

The Luna Pier municipal building is located at 4357 Buckeye Street. It is staffed and occupied during normal business hours. This building provides office space for city staff and serves as the police station for the City. The upper floor of this building is where City Council and other boards and commissions hold regular meetings. The flooring in this second floor meeting room is said to be the floor from the old pier that was recovered from Lake Erie after the pier was destroyed. This building does not have an elevator, but does have a chair lift for those with mobility impairments.

Fire Station & EMS

The Luna Pier Fire Station is located at 4268 Luna Pier Rd, which is just west of Harold Drive. The fire department is staffed with volunteers. The Luna Pier Fire Dept received a grant from FEMA (Assistance to Firefighters Grant) in the amount of \$12,160.00 to help provide personal protective equipment in 2008. The fire station houses two fire trucks and two EMS vehicles.

Library

The Luna Pier Library is located at 4349 Oak St., just north of Luna Pier Road and West of Harold Drive. The Luna Pier Library is part of the Monroe County Library System and is formally known as the Rasey Memorial Library. In 1965, a home owned by the late Mr. and Mrs. Rasey was donated to the city. In, 1966, a remodeled building was opened as the Rasey Memorial Library, a branch of the Monroe County Library System.

DPW building

The Department of Public Works has a facility located on Harold Drive near the municipal boat launch and wastewater treatment plant. This building trucks and other municipal equipment used for infrastructure repair and maintenance.

Beach House

The Luna Pier Beach house is located along the lake shore in Luna Pier Memorial Park. This building provides restroom facilities and concession stand for people using the beach. Parking tickets related to use of the municipal parking lot can also be purchased at the Beach house. The words "Luna Pier" appear on the roof of the structure and provide a familiar landmark for Lake Erie boaters.
