When in doubt, hang up or delete the message and contact us or a trusted source directly. Legitimate organizations will **never** pressure you to act immediately or ask for sensitive information over the phone.

## A Message from Fire Chief Bob Dinius

As your local volunteer fire department, we're committed to keeping our community safe—and that starts at home. Did you know that smoke and carbon monoxide detectors should be replaced every 10 years? Over time, sensors can wear out and become less reliable, even if the device still beeps. If you're unsure how old your detectors are, check the manufacture date on the back and consider replacing them if they're past their prime.

The Luna Pier Fire Department is offering free smoke and combo smoke/carbon monoxide detectors to residents, which is part of a state-funded program. To get one, email Chief Dinius at [lunapierfire@gmail.com](mailto:lunapierfire@gmail.com) to schedule an installation.

Also, don't forget to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors when we "spring forward" or "fall back" with daylight saving time. It's a simple habit that can save lives. Let's work together to keep Luna Pier safe—one battery at a time!

## Building Department – Home Safety

Now that winter is approaching and your homes will be closed and receiving less fresh air, we need to be aware of a potential hidden hazard of carbon monoxide.

Each year in America, more than 150 people die from accidental non-fire related carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning associated with consumer products. These products include faulty, improperly-used or incorrectly-vented fuel-burning appliances such as furnaces, stoves, water heaters and fireplaces.

The U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) would like you to know that there are simple steps you can take to protect yourself from deadly carbon monoxide fumes.

## Understanding the Risk

### **What is carbon monoxide?**

CO, often called "the silent killer," is a gas you cannot see, taste, or smell. It can be created when fossil fuels, such as kerosene, gasoline, coal, natural gas, propane, methane or wood do not burn properly.



### **Where does carbon monoxide come from?**

CO poisoning can result from faulty furnaces or other heating appliances, portable generators, water heaters, clothes dryers or cars left running in garages.

### **What are the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning?**

Symptoms of CO poisoning include headache, nausea and drowsiness. Exposure to undetected high levels of carbon monoxide can be fatal.

## CO Alarm Installation

- Choose a CO alarm that has the label of a recognized testing laboratory. Install and maintain CO alarms inside your home to provide early warning of carbon monoxide.
- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each separate sleeping area, on every level of the home, and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards. For the best protection, have CO alarms that are interconnected throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for placement and mounting height.
- Combination smoke-CO alarms must be installed in accordance with requirements for smoke alarms.
- CO alarms are not substitutes for smoke alarms and vice versa. Know the difference between the sound of smoke alarms and the sound of CO alarms.



## CO Alarms: Testing and Replacement

- Test CO alarms at least once a month and replace them if they fail to respond correctly when tested. The sensors in CO alarms have a limited life. Replace the CO alarm according to manufacturer's instructions or when the end-of-life signal sounds.
- Know the difference between the sound of the CO alarm and the smoke alarm, and their low-battery signals. If the audible low battery signal sounds, replace the batteries or replace the device. If the CO alarm still sounds, get to a fresh air location and call 9-1-1 or the fire department.
- To keep CO alarms working well, follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning.

## CO Precautions

- Have fuel-burning heating equipment (fireplaces, furnaces, water heaters, wood stoves, coal stoves, space heaters and portable heaters) and chimneys inspected by a professional every year.
- Open the damper for proper ventilation before using a fireplace.
- Never use your oven or stovetop to heat your home. The CO gas might kill people and pets.
- When purchasing new heating and cooking equipment, select products tested and labeled by a recognized testing laboratory.
- Make sure all fuel-burning vented equipment is vented to the outside to avoid CO poisoning. Keep the venting for exhaust clear and unblocked.
- If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Never run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not blocked with snow, ice or other materials. The CO gas might kill people and pets.
- Make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove and fireplace are clear of snow and other debris.
- Only use barbecue grills outside, away from all doors, windows, vents and other building openings. Some grills can produce CO gas. Never use grills inside the home or the garage, even if the doors are open.
- Use portable generators outdoors in well-ventilated areas away from all doors, windows, vents and other building openings to prevent exhaust fumes from entering the home.

## If Your CO Alarm Sounds

- Immediately move to a fresh air location (outdoors or by an open window or door). Make sure everyone inside the home is accounted for.
- Call 9-1-1 or the fire department from a fresh air location (outdoors or by an open window). Remain at a fresh air location until emergency personnel arrive to assist you.

## **MESSAGE FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE**

I have to admit, I really enjoy working as the City Clerk. The responsibilities are varied, and for the most part administrative. Keeping the lights on (paying the bills), keeping funders happy (submitting reports), helping the city move forward on its goals and agenda (prepping council meeting packets), and keeping residents informed (updating the city website, posting agendas and meeting minutes to the website, and answering emails, calls, and walk-in requests).



Regarding answering emails, calls and walk-in requests, you would be surprised at the large variety of questions that come our way. Most are easy to answer, but some take research, which we are willing to do. **Q: Can we have our wedding on the beach or pier?** A: Yes, you can have your wedding on the beach or pier. You just have to follow the posted rules (no pets/dogs, no alcohol, no glass, etc.) and you cannot partition off an area to prevent access to others on the beach or pier. One example of a question I did not see coming.

So, if you have a query, give us a call or stop by. Feel free to come down to City Hall to take advantage of the services we provide (parking sticker, notary, boat launch permits, etc.).

## From the Treasurer Department

### WINTER TAXES

Winter Taxes will be mailed out the end of November, and they are payable from December 1, 2025 thru February 14, 2026. After February 14<sup>th</sup>, you can pay you Winter taxes, with penalty added, at Luna Pier City Hall up to February 28<sup>th</sup>. Starting March 1, 2026, taxes will need to be paid at the Monroe County Treasurer's Office, and cannot be paid here at City Hall.

Taxes are payable in person during regular office hours. We accept cash, personal check, or credit card payments (there is a fee of 2.6% for all credit card transactions). The office also has a drop box slot located on the front door of City Hall that you can drop your tax payment in. Please no cash if you use the drop box, and if you would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope.

## Assessing Fall Newsletter Article 2025

Season's greetings from the Assessing Department here at The City of Luna Pier!! Please note that we will be conducting fieldwork throughout the end of the year to ensure uniform and fair assessments in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan. So, you may see us out there looking at properties and parcels and taking pictures for our records.



Here are important dates and facts to remember as the seasons change...

- November 1st is the deadline for filing Principal Residence Exemption Affidavit (Form 2368) for exemption from up to 18-mill school operating tax for the winter tax levy.
- The December Board of Review will meet in December to correct Qualified Errors, and review Poverty Exemptions.

## Planning Commission Notes

The Planning Commission provides recommendations to the City Council on the physical, social and economic development of the City. The City Council may adopt the recommendations or reject them. The Commission is made up of 7 Luna Pier residents, who are appointed by the City Council to 3-year terms. The Planning Commission oversees the development of a Master Plan. ***You can find the latest Master Plan (adopted June 12, 2025) on the city website, on the Planning Commission page.***

The Commission also conducts public hearings on proposed map amendments (rezonings), and text amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. These amendments are typically requested by developers, but changes are also initiated by residents and other city departments.

Planning Commission meetings are held on the fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) Tuesday of the month at 6:00 pm at Water Tower Park Hall, 11345 Harold Dr., Luna Pier. The 6:00 pm meeting start time is new (it used to be 4:00 pm), and this change was made to encourage more residents to attend the meetings and participate in the process. Please, feel free to be there.

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## Lakefront Landowners Rights and Permission Ordinance 111 – Effective March 22, 1983

Just a reminder to all – the Seawall from S. 15<sup>th</sup> Street going south to LaPoint Drive is on private property. Individuals should not be walking along the Seawall past S. 15<sup>th</sup> Street.

The Ordinance states:

*The lakefront owner shall have and enjoy the exclusive rights to the use of the lakefront owner's lands or the filled bottomlands upon which the flood control facilities are Erected including the right to exclude trespassers, connect a temporary dock and place non-permanent structures ...*

Pedestrian traffic along the Seawall is permitted going north of S. 15<sup>th</sup> St. up to the Lighthouse.

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## **Stevens Disposal's Holiday Schedule Pick up**

- ❖ For Memorial and Labor Day all routes run one day behind for the entire week.
- ❖ For Thanksgiving only Thursday and Friday routes run one day behind.
- ❖ For Christmas, New Year's Day and 4th of July, it depends on what day of the week they fall.
  - If one of these holidays is on a Monday all routes run one day behind.
  - If the holiday is on Tuesday, then Tuesday through Friday run one day behind.
  - If the holiday is on Wednesday, then Wednesday through Friday run one day behind.
  - If the holiday is on Thursday, then Thursday and Friday run one day behind.
  - If the holiday is on Friday, then only Friday runs a day behind.
  - If any of these holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday, we do not run a day behind.
- ❖ If there is ever change from the above schedule, a letter or phone call will be made.
- ❖ When Friday routes are picked up on a Saturday, you should put your trash out the night before as those routes start between 2a.m. and 3a.m. because the landfills close earlier on Saturday.

# Downtown Development Authority (DDA) Progress Update

## Overview

The DDA (Downtown Development Authority) receives funding based on increases in property tax values within the downtown district (which also includes properties along Harold Drive south of Luna Pier Rd). Funds received are to be utilized within the downtown district to create a more attractive district for businesses, visitors, and residents. The DDA was established in 2013 but did not begin generating incremental funds until 2021.

## Current Projects

- **Sidewalks** – Quotes are being secured to expand & widen sidewalks along the beachfront and Luna Pier parking lot area. Plans include cement pad for giant Adirondack chair (built and donated by Ryan Schwartz & friends)
- **Decorative Street Light Replacements** – Plans include replacement of streetlights installed over 20 years ago. DDA is currently collaborating with Consumers Energy to obtain cost and determine placement of streetlights. Project is likely to involve multiple phases. DDA currently expects to initiate Phase I in Spring of 2026 that will focus on replacement of lights in the area between I-75 and Harold Dr. Phase II is anticipated to replace lights in 1<sup>st</sup> Street Park area (east of Harold).
- **Invasive Vegetation Treatment** – DDA secured contractor and obtained authorizations from property owners to treat invasive vegetation (phragmites) along shoreline within pier area. \$2k cost was split between DDA and the City.
- **Night Market** – DDA continued to work in partnership with Parks & Recreation on 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Night Market. We appreciate the many businesses that participated in and sponsored the event. Revenue generated by this event is used to offset costs of the event; any remaining proceeds are to be used to fund the pavilion improvements (roof replacement and other maintenance). Last year's event generated \$1,020 and this year's event generated \$3,223.
- **Social Media** – DDA continues to share updates from local businesses & groups on the Luna Pier Downtown Development Authority Facebook group.
- **By-Laws / Ordinance / Plan Updates** – The DDA has recently updated/approved their By-laws and will continue to work on updates to ordinances and the Tax Incremental Fund plans.
- **Parking** – DDA is working to transition rate maintenance and enforcement to city resources. Revenue raised from parking kiosks is approximately \$120k per year.
- **Michigan Downtown Association (MDA)** – DDA has continued their membership with the MDA and continues to utilize and access online training and attend appropriate events and conferences.

DDA projects remain on track. Additional focus will be placed on ensuring that we hold the required public meetings to ensure stakeholder engagement and transparent communication.

## Municipal Services News

Winter will soon be here and we are asking for help from all residents. To make our job easier and more efficient we would appreciate residents' cooperation in **not parking on side streets** when there is any measurable snow fall. In addition, there is no parking of vehicles or trailers of any kind at the end of streets with no outlets. Please keep personal items well off the road (basketball hoops) so that they do not get damaged by the plow.



**Due to liability reasons, we are no longer able to receive used oil, antifreeze or any other fluids from residents.**



We are still having a problem with someone doing donuts in the boat launch parking lot. This is creating ruts and making it hard for people to drive and walk thru the parking lot. If you are the one please stop. If you see someone doing this, please take a picture of the vehicle if possible and report it to the Luna Pier Police or City Hall.

Please check to see if your sump pump or downspouts are connected to the sanitary sewer, if they are please reroute them. The load to the WWTP that these illegal connections are adding sometimes triples the flow at the plant. This is much higher than what the plant is designed for and adds to the cost of treating the wastewater.

The property at the south end of Harold by the burn pile and compost pile is **NOT** a dump.

The Burn Pile is for **branches only**, **NO** cardboard, trash, furniture or lumber is allowed.

The compost pile is for **yard waste only**, **NO** cardboard, trash, furniture or lumber is allowed.
